TUE • Britain's smallest city, **St Davids**, owes its status to the 12th century purple sandstone cathedral which dominates the tranquil vale in which it sits. Spend time in this character-full town surrounded by National Park scenery. Continue to Pembrokeshire's finest stately home, **Picton Castle**. This ancient building has roots as a medieval castle, transformed into an 18th century home for the elite. The surrounding gardens boast one of the best plant collections in Wales including an enchanting Walled Garden and an exotic Jungle Garden.

WED • Discover how a picturesque Welsh valley village became the centre of Wales' global wool industry at **The National Wool Museum**. Try your hand at carding, spinning and sewing as you follow the process from fleece to fabric inside restored listed mill buildings. Continue to the Ceredigion coast to spend time amongst the charming, colourful houses that fill the little town of **Aberaeron**. Perhaps treat yourself to ice cream whilst enjoying harbour views? Finish the day at **Llanerchaeron (NT)**, an elegant Georgian mansion, remarkably unaltered for over 200 years and set within the beautiful Aeron Valley. Compare the calming classical details of the villa to the busy staff quarters, discover a curious antique collection and wander in the Walled Garden.

THUR • Enjoy a scenic drive through Pembrokeshire Coast National Park to spend time in the picture-perfect seaside town of **Tenby**. Soft sandy beaches, crystal clear waters, a quaint fishing harbour and pastel-coloured Victorian houses give Tenby an old-world charm that's hard to match. Add to that a friendly local vibe and tempting local shops and cafés and you have a perfect summers' day by the sea. MON • Perhaps make use of the hotel leisure before dinner.

TUE • Follow the winding drive to **Leighton Hall**, the much-loved home of the Gillow furniture making family with an 800-year history. Each room, from the modest chapel to the imposing dining room is still in use and with no roped-off areas there's so much to see! Outside, expect fine country views, colourful borders and a 19th century Walled Garden. This afternoon, take a country cruise along the **Lancaster Canal**, enjoying views of the Bowland Hills and keeping an eye (and ear) out for the resident herons, swallows, kingfishers and cormorants.

WED • Ride from the market town of Bury, following the pretty River Irwell through lush green countryside, to the village of Rawtenstall on the East Lancashire Railway. From here, continue north to Oswaldtwistle Mills where over 100 retailers are uniquely housed inside a former Weaving Mill - they've recently enhanced the shopping experience with a huge store re-site and refit! Then, sit back and watch the scenery roll by on a guided coach tour through the beautiful Ribble Valley. Hear stories from one of Roman Britain's largest ports, one of Queen Elizabeth II's homes and even Sherlock Holmes!

THUR • Be blown away at **The World of Glass** inside the Victorian town of St Helens. Watch a glass blowing demonstration, see glass that has survived 3000 years and cross a glass bridge towards The Tank House to discover how it all began! To Bolton for a traditional **fish and chip lunch** before a scenic drive through the fells and moors back to the hotel, past Winter Hill and the Belmont Reservoir.

SAT • Soak up views of Morecambe Bay and The Lake District as you cross the Irish Sea, arriving on the island at 18:00.

SUN • Meet retired polo horses and tram horses at the **Home of Rest for Old Horses**. Over 90 horses roam the lush green fields, enjoying their final years being pampered by the loving team. Continue to the island's ancient capital of **Castletown**, with picturesque fishing cottages along the harbour and a superbly preserved Viking castle towering above. Back to the roads to uncover the IOM's famous motoring history with a visit to the Motor Museum - a petrolhead's paradise! Highlights include the record breaking 500 Manxman, steam cars, a Cadillac V16 and the 1953 Humber Super Snipe tourer used by Queen Elizabeth II.

WED • Begin on the west coast in **Peel**, a beautiful bay enclosed by a medieval castle, a lively harbour and a promenade selling local treats. Ride out to the island's southernmost tip to enjoy some of the nation's greatest scenery from **The Sound** (where you'll also find a delicious café with panoramic views). Return to Douglas for a guided tour of **Tynwald** – which claims to be the oldest continuous parliamentary assembly in the world! Some parts of Tynwald are only accessible by stairs.

MON • Welcome to Wales, with **tea/coffee** waiting for you at the hotel.

TUE • Spend time in **Caernarfon**, on the shores of the Menai Strait with Wales' most famous castle as your backdrop - where HM The King was crowned Prince of Wales in 1969. Wander through the pretty streets, watch boats bobbing on the water and take in the distant mountain views. Camera at the ready as we drive over the Nant Francon Pass, then through the Vale of Conwy to Llandudno, to spend time by the sea in a resort that has remained largely unchanged since Victorian times.

WED • Steam along the UK's longest heritage railway from Caernarfon, past Snowdon, to the riverside village of Beddgelert on an unforgettable two-hour journey on the **Welsh Highland Railway**. Panoramic windows ensure unrivalled views of ancient woodland, mountains, rivers and castles. Then to the unique, Italian inspired village of Portmeirion with colour-washed buildings and a lively central piazza. Clough Williams-Ellis envisaged this coastal village in the mid 1920s to prove that a beautiful location could be developed without spoiling it.

THUR • Cross the Menai Bridge to the Isle of Anglesey and board an 80-minute seacoast safari to **Puffin Island**. Informative commentary will guide you through the resident and visiting birds, you may even be lucky enough to spot a grey seal or dolphin. Spend the afternoon at Plas Cadnant - Anglesey's hidden gardens and winners at the 2023 Nation's Favourite Gardens awards. This ancient garden is under careful restoration, so far, a curved walled garden, secret valley garden with waterfalls and a woodland garden - complete with a 19th century folly have been discovered.

FRI • *Amser i fynd adref* – Time to go home.

MON • Perhaps make use of the hotel leisure before dinner.

TUE • Cruise the River Severn with tea/coffee & biscuits, marveling at historic sites such as Shrewsbury Castle and the medieval Town Walls during this peaceful 40-minute cruise. Enjoy free time in Shrewsbury this delightful town boasts over 600 listed buildings and was described by Sunday Times Style Magazine as "a half-timbered beauty awash with independents". Continue to 18th century Attingham Park (NT) and discover an impressive Regency Mansion set within 200 acres of parkland. With impressive architecture and fine furnishings up top, and busy staff quarters below, you'll gain a real insight into the lives of those that once lived and worked here.

WED • The **British Ironwork Centre** is 'Art With Conscience'. Follow trails through the UK's largest collection of metal sculptures looking out for the *Spoon Gorilla* (made with 40,000 spoons) and an entire recycled tractor that's been used to create *Head On With The Future*. This afternoon, discover 700 years of history at **Chirk Castle & Garden (NT)** – this magnificent medieval fortress is the last castle of this period that's still lived in today. Lavish interiors include a 17th century Long Gallery and rich tapestries in the State Rooms, outside herbaceous borders and rose gardens should be alive with colour.

THUR • Visit the (recently restored) **Museum of the Gorge** and learn about the its key role in the Industrial Revolution, enjoying views down to the famous Iron Bridge from outside. Continue your links with the River Severn during a journey on the **Severn Valley Railway**, the line follows this ancient waterway and crosses it at the impressive 200ft Victoria Bridge. Spend time in the medieval town of **Ludlow** amongst almost 500 listed buildings before taking the scenic route back to the hotel past Wenlock Edge – a narrow limestone escarpment with flower rich grasslands and ancient woodlands.

FRI • Spend the morning immersed in the sights, sounds and smells of Victorian life at **Blists Hill Open Air Museum**. Inspect unusual remedies at the Pharmacy, watch 19th century candlemakers at work, see a traditional printing press in action and perhaps treat yourself to traditional fish & chips before heading home.

Visit the picture-postcard, pastel-coloured harbour town of **Portpatrick**, where cliffs surround the small bay. This afternoon, wander in **Castle Kennedy Gardens**, where you'll find a riot of colour in the Walled Garden & rare Victorian water lilies in the round pond – with impressive castle ruins as your backdrop.

Shaws Coaches has been on the road since 1922...

Shaws Coaches was founded in 1922 by Edwin 'Teddy' Shaw, the grandfather of the previous partners, Jane, Richard and Chris. Edwin had an engineering background in Yorkshire but during the Great War he was transferred to Peterborough to work for Peter Brotherhood as a millwright. Edwin fell for a local girl, they moved to Maxey and took the momentous decision to buy their first bus, which was kept in Mr. Frisby's barn on Castle End Road. They ran a local service into Peterborough along with anything else that came their way, including furniture removals! They couldn't afford to have the vehicle off the road for long and repairs were usually made by candle-light with the help of neighbours.

A couple of years later they took a chance and purchased the house and land at 49 High Street (where we are still based). After the war Edwin worked hard to build the business back up and by then he was joined by his son, Harry, whose favourite job was as team driver for Peterborough United! Harry gradually took over the running of the business and it flourished under his leadership. He had a real talent for buying and selling coaches with many winter Sundays spent journeying across the country to "look at a bus".

Harry died suddenly in 1981 and it was then that his children Jane, Richard and Chris inherited the business with Richard's wife Carol joining in 2010 and his daughter Tory, joining in 2015. Shaws first holiday brochure was published in 1982 with just six tours, one of which had just six passengers (including two family members!). Fortunately, the others did rather better and they risked increasing the programme to ten departures, and the rest, as they say, is history!

In early 2025, partners Jane, Richard and Chris took the momentous decision to retire and on 2 May the business was transferred to new ownership. New manager, Joanna Bonnett, lives in Peterborough and runs another successful coach operation in Welwyn - Reg's Coaches. Reg's was founded in 1962 and retains the supportive family feel that has been key to Shaws' own success. Shaws will remain at their base in Maxey offering the same professional, friendly service that they always have done with the support of a loyal team that have transferred to the new ownership and with the full backing of Reg's Coaches.
